Meanwhile, a senior Palestinian security official in Gaza said that security agencies launched a campaign immediately after the ceasefire to restore internal stability following Israel's deliberate attempt to plunge the Strip into chaos and violence.

Since October 7, 2023, Israel has killed 67,967 and injured 170,179 others, the majority of whom are women and children, according to the Palestinian Ministry of Health in Gaza.

PALESTINIAN MEDIA: Israeli forces arrested Murad Shtaiwi, director of the Anti-Wall and Settlement Resistance Commission, after storming his home in the town of Kafr Qaddum, east of Qalqilya, in the occupied West Bank.

Israeli Raids in Occupied West Bank

A series of intensive Israeli military operations swept across the occupied West Bank overnight and into Thursday morning, marked by arrests, home demolitions, and raids, while Israel's government indicated that the Rafah crossing will remain closed.

West Bank Raids

Israeli occupation forces launched multiple incursions across the West Bank, resulting in arrests and damage to property:

Jenin: Occupation forces stormed the eastern district of Jenin city, arresting three young men.

Qalqilya Area: In Kafr Qaddum, east of Qalqilya, forces arrested Murad Shteiwi, the Director of the Wall and Settlement Resistance Commission, after raiding his home. Troops transformed several houses into military barracks and closed the town's entrances.

Azzun (East Qalqilya): occupation forces also raided the town of Azzun.

Ramallah: Israeli military bulldozers, escorted by troops, demolished a house in the village of Al-Mughayyir, east of Ramallah.

Occupied Jerusalem: Forces raided homes and destroyed their contents in the neighborhood of Issawiya, northeast of occupied Jerusalem.

Casualties:

Eight Palestinians, including four children, were injured by Israeli gunfire during a raid on Nablus city, which included the siege of a house and an incursion into the Nablus Municipality fire station.

Two other Palestinians were injured by live fire, and others suffered gas inhalation during confrontations in Qalandia and Al-Ram, north of Jerusalem.

Ceasefire & Rafah Crossing Status

Phase Two Link:

Israeli radio cited an official source stating that Israel will not begin the second phase of the war cessation agreement until the complete return of the bodies of all deceased captives.

Rafah Border:

Separately, Israeli radio reported that the government has decided not to open the Rafah crossing until Hamas "intensifies the return of the bodies of Israeli captives." This indicates a continued policy of using humanitarian access as leverage in the negotiation process.

Other Key Developments

Al-Aqsa Mosque: The Jerusalem Governorate reported that over 9,820 settlers stormed the courtyards of the Al-Aqsa Mosque compound during last week's Jewish holidays.

Prisoner Account: An Israeli soldier, Matan Engrest, recently released from captivity with Hamas's al-Qassam Brigades, stated that his captors granted his requests for Jewish prayer items, including tefillin, a prayer book (siddur), and a Torah scroll.

US Relations Concern:

Israeli radio reported that the Prime Minister's Office is worried that passing a Knesset law aimed at strengthening the occupation of the West Bank could ignite a crisis with US President Donald Trump.

Gaza Attack:

Artillery shelling and live fire by Israeli forces were reported east of the Shujaiya neighborhood in Gaza City.

Human Rights Watch:

Human Rights Watch called on Israel to completely lift its illegal blockade and facilitate reconstruction in Gaza and stressed the need for accountability for serious crimes committed in Gaza.

He added that Hamas is already digging in search of the bodies, some of which have been buried for a long time, while others are under the rubble.

"There is no reason for the US army to intervene in Gaza," Trump said.

Handcuffed and Blindfolded: Bodies of 90 Palestinians Returned by Israel
