France and ten other countries formally recognized Palestine at a UN summit in New York, amid Israel's ongoing genocide in Gaza.

Meanwhile, as the death toll rises, the Gaza Health Ministry announced on Monday that Israeli bombardment around medical facilities has forced the shutdown of Al-Rantisi Children's Hospital and Gaza City's Eye Hospital, the only public eye-care center in the besieged enclave.

Since October 7, 2023, Israel has killed 65,382 and injured 166,985 others, the majority of whom are women and children, according to the Palestinian Ministry of Health in Gaza.

AL-JAZEERA: Spanish government sources confirmed a royal decree has been issued to cut ties with Israel's arms industry. The decree imposes strict controls on arms exports to Israel and criminalizes the passage of Israeli arms shipments through Spanish ports.

He claimed the US never sought a ground invasion of Gaza City, wants the war to end quickly, and will focus on peace after the war. He rejected recognition of a Palestinian state during the conflict, claiming the US is not isolated but playing a leading role in efforts to end the war.

He said Hamas must release hostages immediately and stressed the war must end through negotiations to return all remaining captives at once. Trump claimed most hostages have already been released under his leadership.

News Roundup: Israeli Officer Killed in Gaza Amidst Ongoing Attacks and International Medical Demands

Israeli Military Deaths:

The Israeli army announced the death of an officer with the rank of major in fighting in northern Gaza.

Israel's Channel 12 reported that this brings the total number of Israeli officers and soldiers killed since the start of the conflict to 911.

According to the Israeli public broadcaster Kan, this major is the first Israeli soldier to be killed in Gaza City since the military operation to occupy the city began two weeks ago.

Intense Bombardment:

Neighborhoods in Gaza City are still experiencing intense bombing and massive explosions from armored vehicles.

Palestinian sources also reported that Israeli forces carried out the demolition of residential buildings on Al-Nafaq Street in Gaza City early Tuesday morning.

Civilian Presence:

Despite the intense bombardment, approximately 900,000 Palestinians remain in Gaza City and have refused to leave.

European Demand:

In a joint statement, the foreign ministers of several European countries, including Finland, called on Israel to reopen the medical corridor to the West Bank and Jerusalem to resume the evacuation of patients from Gaza.

Lifting Restrictions:

The statement emphasized the urgent need to expand medical treatment for Gaza's patients due to the escalating humanitarian crisis.

The countries, which include 25 nations in the joint declaration, also called on Israel to lift all restrictions on the supply of medicine and medical equipment to Gaza in accordance with international law.

Continued Voyage:

The "Global Flotilla of Resilience" continues its voyage toward the Gaza Strip in an attempt to break the blockade and deliver aid to the starving population.

Israeli Strikes in Gaza, as Two-State Solution Conference Concludes Airstrike on Old City:

An Israeli airstrike on a residential building in the Old City of Gaza killed two Palestinians and wounded others early Tuesday.

Continuous Bombardment:

Israeli warplanes launched new aerial raids on Gaza City, with continuous artillery shelling reported in the northern parts of the city.

"New York Declaration" Adopted:

The joint statement from the presidency of the Two-State Solution conference called for the rapid implementation of the "New York Declaration." The declaration, which received "exceptional support" from the UN General Assembly, is presented as a principled and realistic alternative to the cycle of violence.

Key Priorities: The statement highlighted several priorities, including:

Ending the war in Gaza and ensuring the release of all detainees.

Calling for a permanent ceasefire and a hostage-for-prisoner exchange.

Ensuring the unhindered flow of humanitarian aid to all parts of Gaza.

News Roundup: Global Leaders at UN Conference Condemn Israel, as More Nations Recognize Palestine

A global conference on the two-state solution in New York has become a focal point for international condemnations of Israel's policies and a wave of new recognitions of a Palestinian state.

New Recognitions:

Andorra, Malta, Belgium, Luxembourg, and Monaco all announced their recognition of a Palestinian state. Their leaders stated that the move is a demonstration of their commitment to a two-state solution and is not a reward for violence.

Canada's Stance:

Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney announced Canada's recognition, calling it an acknowledgment of the Palestinian people's right to self-determination. He criticized the Netanyahu government for systematically working to prevent a Palestinian state and for violating international law with its settlement expansion.

UK and EU Positions:

The UK's Foreign Secretary Yvette Cooper said a Palestinian state is an "inalienable right" and accused the Netanyahu government of choosing to escalate the war and obstruct aid.

The EU Commission President Kaja Kallas said the two-state solution is the "only peace plan" and pledged to create a donor group and a reconstruction mechanism for Palestine.

Criticism from Around the World:

Brazil's President Lula da Silva called what is happening in Gaza genocide.

Spain's Foreign Minister said his country, as one that believes in human rights, cannot have a normal relationship with Israel amidst an ongoing war.

Germany's Foreign Minister reaffirmed his country's commitment to Israel's security but said settlements are an "obstacle to peace" and that people in Gaza are living "in a hell on earth."

Egypt's Prime Minister stated that his country rejects any attempts to displace the Palestinian people and that security for Israel will not be achieved through military force.

South Africa's President Cyril Ramaphosa called on all UN member states to recognize a Palestinian state on the 1967 borders and condemned the genocide in Gaza.

Gaza and West Bank Updates

Gaza Genocide Actions:

Palestinian media reported that Israeli warplanes and artillery shelled the outskirts of Al-Shate' refugee camp and areas near UNRWA schools in western Gaza City.

Footage also showed what were described as "terrifying explosions" as Israeli forces detonated booby-trapped armored vehicles.

West Bank Clashes:

Sources reported clashes and gunfire during an Israeli raid on the town of Sa'ir and the Al-Aroub refugee camp near Hebron. Israeli forces also raided the town of Surra in the northern West Bank.

Israeli and US Reactions

Warning from the US:

According to the Times of Israel, the Trump administration has warned Israel against annexing the West Bank in retaliation for the international recognition of a Palestinian state.

European Retaliation:

A European official told the Washington Post that Europe could respond "more harshly," possibly with trade sanctions on settlement exports, if Israel retaliates by annexing the West Bank.

Netanyahu's Reliance on Washington:

An NBC source said that Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu will not take any retaliatory action against the recognitions without Washington's support.

Qatar's Warning:

The Qatari Foreign Ministry spokesperson said that Israel's campaign has targeted many countries, including Qatar, and that its maverick aggression puts all regional agreements at risk.

Netanyahu is expected to discuss the plan with Trump during their meeting at the White House. Earlier, the White House announced that Trump will hold a "multilateral meeting" with Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Indonesia, Turkey, Pakistan, Egypt, the United Arab Emirates, and Jordan.
