Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said the war will conclude only after the completion of the second phase of the ceasefire agreement, which involves the disarmament of Hamas.

Meanwhile, the Al-Qassam Brigades announced that they will hand over two bodies of Israeli captives recovered earlier today in the Gaza Strip.

Since October 7, 2023, Israel has killed 68,159 and injured 170,203 others, the majority of whom are women and children, according to the Palestinian Ministry of Health in Gaza.

The statement added that Israeli forces mutilated the bodies of Palestinians, calling it a war crime and a crime against humanity, and held Israel fully responsible for any collapse of the agreement, urging mediators to act to stop the ongoing aggression.

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu is currently evaluating the security situation in the Gaza Strip with Defense Minister Yisrael Katz and other officials following what they termed a "breach of the ceasefire" in Rafah, southern Gaza.

Israeli Channel 14 reported that the Israeli occupation Air Force launched a series of raids on Rafah in response to this alleged breach.

The Israeli Public Broadcasting Corporation (KAN) stated the Air Force's attacks followed an exchange of fire between the Israeli military and 'armed militants'.

Al Mayadeen, citing Israeli media, said that two Israeli soldiers were reportedly killed, and two others were injured, as a result of a sniper operation and the detonation of an explosive device in Rafah.

Israeli Channel 12, citing sources, claimed that the raids on Rafah were also an effort "to protect the militias of Yasser Abu Shabab," a reference that suggests Israel may be targeting Palestinian groups responsible for attacking these militias or providing them with cover.

This is What We Know So Far:

Israeli Prime Minister Netanyahu is holding an urgent security assessment with his defense minister and top officials over the situation in Rafah.

The meeting was prompted by an alleged "breach of the ceasefire" in southern Gaza.

Israeli Air Force jets have launched strikes on Rafah, with Israeli media characterizing the attacks as a response to the ceasefire violation.

The immediate cause of the escalation appears to be a deadly incident, as alleged by Israeli sources: two Israeli soldiers were reported killed and two wounded in Rafah by a combination of sniper fire and an explosive device.

One Israeli media outlet suggested the air raids were also intended to "protect the militias of Yasser Abu Shabab," indicating a complex security dynamic on the ground.
