US President Donald Trump announced on Tuesday the start of the second phase of the Gaza agreement, confirming that he had spoken with the Hamas. He added that the discussions with Hamas involved senior US officials.

Meanwhile, Red Cross vehicles collected the bodies of Israeli captives in Gaza City.

Since October 7, 2023, Israel has killed 67,938 and injured 169,170 others, the majority of whom are women and children, according to the Palestinian Ministry of Health in Gaza.

US President Donald Trump said that Washington wants Hamas to give up its weapons, adding that the movement has agreed to do so, and "if it doesn't, we will take care of it ourselves."

Trump stated that Hamas is searching for the bodies of the slain hostages, and that some of the bodies are located in tunnels.

He added that Hamas is already digging in search of the bodies, some of which have been buried for a long time, while others are under the rubble.

"There is no reason for the US army to intervene in Gaza," Trump said.

The Palestinian Red Crescent reported that a Palestinian was killed after being struck on the head by Israeli occupation forces near the Qalandia checkpoint, north of Jerusalem.

Israeli occupation forces launched widespread raids and incursions overnight Wednesday across various areas of the occupied West Bank.

These operations included the Jalazone camp and other towns north of Ramallah, Kafr Aqab village north of Jerusalem, Bethlehem, and parts of Hebron.

Occupation forces also raided the homes of recently released prisoners, warning their families against holding any celebrations for their release.

News Roundup: Rafah Crossing Reopening Confirmed; Israeli Fire in Gaza City Amid Continued Aid Crisis

Rafah Crossing to Reopen:

The Israeli Public Broadcasting Corporation stated that 600 aid trucks will enter Gaza with the reopening of the Rafah crossing today (Wednesday).

Israel reportedly decided to proceed with the reopening and aid entry after Hamas returned the bodies of four detainees on Tuesday evening.

Earlier, Channel 13 initially reported a decision not to reopen the crossing and reduce aid due to the incomplete handover of all remains.

Famine Risk Persists:

The Euro-Med Human Rights Monitor warned that the danger of famine has not left the Gaza Strip due to the continued reduction of aid, which reflects Israel's "insistence on using starvation as a tool of genocide."

The Monitor added that the current limited aid is only a tiny fraction of the actual needs and expressed concern over Israeli threats to reduce aid and keep Rafah closed over the issue of detainees' remains.

Israeli Tanks Fire East of Gaza City:

Al-Jazeera's correspondent reported that Israeli tanks opened fire in the eastern part of Gaza City.

Released Prisoner Hospitalized in Gaza:

The released prisoner, Dr. Mohammed Asaliya, who was freed on Monday as part of the exchange deal, was transferred to Al-Shifa Hospital in Gaza City. He is suffering from seizures and severe heart pain resulting from torture he endured in Israeli prisons.

Estimated Total Prisoners Freed in Al-Aqsa Flood: Following the recent exchange, the Palestinian Resistance is estimated to have secured the release of nearly 4,000 detainees/prisoners from Israeli prisons in total since the start of the Al-Aqsa Flood operation.

Two Injured by Israeli Fire in Khan Yunis:

Two Palestinians were injured by Israeli occupation forces' gunfire in Khan Yunis.

Intense Clashes Reported East of Jabaliya:

Fierce clashes were reported in east Jabaliya between Interior Ministry security and individuals associated with the Israeli occupation.
