Thousands of Palestinian detainees were released from Israeli prisons following the ceasefire agreement between the Palestinian Resistance and Israel.

Meanwhile, heads of state and senior officials from several countries arrived in Egypt's Red Sea city of Sharm el-Sheikh to participate in an international peace summit on Gaza.

Since October 7, 2023, Israel has killed 67,806 and injured 170,066 others, the majority of whom are women and children, according to the Palestinian Ministry of Health in Gaza.

Children must be sheltered in tents and provided with blankets.

We have been allowed to bring in aid since May, but some restrictions are still imposed on us.

We need a steady flow of humanitarian assistance into Gaza and the reopening of all crossings."

UNDP: The United Nations Development Programme estimated the cost of rebuilding Gaza at \$70 billion, noting that there are at least 55 million tons of debris across the Strip.

Five Palestinians Killed by Israeli Fire in Gaza City's Sheja'iyya Neighborhood

PALESTINIAN MEDIA:

The Al-Ahli Baptist Hospital announced that five Palestinians were killed by Israeli fire in the Shuja'iyya neighborhood, east of Gaza City.

The Israeli army claimed it fired at the Palestinians "to remove a threat after detecting suspicious individuals attempting to cross the yellow line" in Gaza.

It added that the "suspects" tried to approach Israeli soldiers despite warning shots, urging compliance with "instructions."

Over 10,000 people remain under the debris, and we lack the means to reach them. War remnants and unexploded ordnance pose a major threat to civilians' lives."

The UN Interim Force in Lebanon (UNIFIL) reported that it has documented over 2,200 Israeli military activities north of the Blue Line and more than 6,200 Israeli air violations since the cessation of hostilities agreement between Lebanon and Israel went into effect last November.

UNIFIL stated in its report (published Monday evening) that it monitors violations of UN Resolution 1701 in its area of operations in Southern Lebanon and reports them to the UN Security Council.

These documented violations include the Israeli presence and military activities inside Lebanon and the daily crossings of the Blue Line.

Trump Focuses on Reconstruction, Not Two-State Solution:

US President Donald Trump stated that the current focus is on rebuilding Gaza and not on the "one-state or two-state solution," noting that many people desire different outcomes.

Difficult Talks Begin on Gaza's Future:

Qatari Foreign Ministry Spokesperson Majed Al Ansari told Fox News that difficult discussions have now begun to secure and administer Gaza and ensure the war does not reignite. He noted that Phase II discussions were postponed to ensure the success of Phase I.

Sharm El-Sheikh Document:

A document signed by mediators at the Sharm El-Sheikh summit stressed support for Trump's efforts to end the war and achieve lasting peace and prosperity for all parties. It warned that the Middle East "cannot tolerate a continuous cycle of wars" or the incomplete application of negotiated terms.

White House Hails Deal:

A White House document stated that the Gaza agreement opens a chapter with a shared vision for peace and prosperity and affirmed the resolve to dismantle extremism in all its forms.

UK's Starmer on "Peace Council":

UK Prime Minister Keir Starmer said the formation of the proposed "Peace Council"—part of the US-suggested plan to end the war—remains under discussion.

Italy Pledges Support for Reconstruction:

Italian Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni committed her country to contributing to the stability and reconstruction of the Gaza Strip.

UN Allocates \$20 Million for Gaza Aid:

The UN Under-Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs, Tom Fletcher, announced an additional \$11 million from the UN Emergency Response Fund, bringing the total allocation for Gaza relief to \$20 million (for food, water, shelter, and medical services).

Medical Supplies Enter Gaza:

WHO Director-General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus reported that eight trucks loaded with medical supplies have entered the Gaza Strip, stressing the need to rebuild the health system.

Australia Considers Sending Troops:

Australian Defense Minister Richard Marles stated that Australia will consider sending Australian troops to the Middle East to support peacekeeping efforts in the region.

Released Prisoners Arrive in Egypt:

Palestinian media broadcast footage showing the arrival of several deported, released prisoners in Cairo, Egypt, hours after their release from Israeli jails.

Faction Leaders Receive Deported Prisoners:

Further footage showed leaders of Palestinian factions receiving the deported, released prisoners in the Egyptian capital, Cairo.

Raids on Released Prisoners' Homes:

Israeli Occupation Forces raided the homes of several released Palestinian prisoners in the occupied West Bank, including those of Mundher Nour in Anabta, Salam Zaghl in Shweikeh, and Tareq Hassain in Qalqilya.

Israeli Forces Raid West Bank Areas:

Israeli occupation forces reportedly raided Nablus from the Awarta checkpoint, as well as the New Askar refugee camp and Roujib village east of the city. Forces also raided the town of Tammoun south of Tubas.

Some of them have lost limbs.

Most were injured during the war and received no medical care in Israeli prisons.

There are many doctors imprisoned by the occupation.

The tragedy in Gaza's hospitals continues—we urgently need continuous convoys of medical supplies.

Cancer and heart patients have not received treatment for months."
