UNRWA Warns of Displacement and Destruction:

The UNRWA Director in the West Bank emphasized that destruction and forced displacement are continuing in the northern West Bank, specifically citing settler violence and the evacuation of camps (Jenin, Tulkarem, Nur Shams). He also warned that Israeli anti-UNRWA laws have led to the de facto closure of its schools and the expulsion of staff.

Knesset Vote Expected on 'Sovereignty' Bill:

The Israeli Broadcasting Authority reported expectations that the Knesset will vote today on the preliminary discussion of a bill to impose what is referred to as "sovereignty over the West Bank."

Settlers Establish New Outpost Rooms:

Palestinian platforms documented illegal Israeli Jewish settlers establishing new rooms in an outpost in the Al-Qala area near the village of Al-Mughayir (east of Ramallah).

Preventing Olive Harvest:

Israeli occupation forces prevented farmers from accessing their lands to harvest olives in Khirbet Yanun, south of Nablus.

An Israeli special force surrounded a residential building in the Umm Al-Sharayet neighborhood in Al-Bireh.

Israeli forces raided the town of Tamoun (south of Tubas) and conducted raids and arrests in Qalqilya and Hebron.

ICJ Ruling Expected on Aid Blockade:

The International Court of Justice (ICJ) is set to issue its ruling today on whether Israel violated international law by imposing a months-long siege on humanitarian aid destined for the Gaza Strip. The non-binding advisory opinion could increase international pressure.

UN Calls for Shelter Boost:

The UN called for a significantly larger quantity of shelter materials to enter Gaza before winter, urging Israel to grant more permits for relief organizations.

WFP: North Gaza Supplies Insufficient:

The World Food Programme (WFP) affirmed that supplies are reaching north Gaza but "not in the required quantities" and that overall aid volumes are insufficient due to limited open crossings.

Medical Shortages:

The Director of Pediatrics at Nasser Medical Hospital stated that 80% of medical laboratory analyses at the facility are unavailable.

US Secretary of State to Visit Israel:

Israeli Channel 12 reported that US Secretary of State Marco Rubio will arrive in Israel tomorrow for a two-day visit.

CENTCOM Opens Coordination Center:

US Central Command (CENTCOM) announced the official opening of a Civil-Military Coordination Center in Israel to monitor the ceasefire implementation and support stability in Gaza.

Internal Israeli Politics:

A Maariv (Israeli newspaper) poll suggested that 15.3% of Israelis who voted for the ruling coalition intend to shift their support to opposition parties.

Prisoner Conditions:

The Palestinian Center for Defense of Prisoners reported that the conditions for Palestinian detainees in Israeli prisons are "extremely critical," with nearly 1,300 detainees from Gaza enduring poor living and health conditions.

Captive Burial Notifications:

The Israeli army notified the families of captive Arieh Zalmanovich and another captive of the possibility of their burial after identity verification is completed.
