# Israeli Strikes Killed Captives; WFP Says Gaza Needs 'Intense Medical Effort' to Reverse Famine

Israeli Strikes Killed Detainees:

Yedioth Ahronoth newspaper, citing Israeli security sources, revealed that Israeli rescue operations in Gaza were marred by "intelligence errors," which in some cases led to the deaths of detainees by Israeli army fire.

The source stated that intelligence on detainee locations was not 100% accurate and was subject to change instantly, even moments before air raids, resulting in some detainee deaths.

#### Aid Insufficient; Gaza Needs to be Inundated with Food:

The World Food Programme (WFP) spokesperson told Al-Mayadeen that the volume of aid entering Gaza is not at the required level and stressed the need to inundate Gaza with foodstuffs.

The WFP spokesperson added that reversing the current level of famine requires intensive medical efforts alongside sufficient food.

#### Five Palestinians Injured by Settler Attack in Silwad:

The Palestinian Ministry of Health reported that five Palestinians sustained various injuries after being beaten by settlers in the town of Silwad, north of Ramallah.

Sources reported that Israeli settlers attacked a Palestinian vehicle in the village of Zuweidin, near Yatta, south of Hebron.

# Israeli Source Admits Air Strikes Killed Detained Israelis; Failed Rescue Attempt Detailed

#### **Detainees Killed by Israeli Strikes:**

The Israeli newspaper Yedioth Ahronoth, citing an Israeli security source, revealed that intelligence regarding the locations of Israeli detainees in Gaza was not 100% accurate and was subject to change instantly, leading to the deaths of some detainees during Israeli air raids.

The source explained that the Israeli army conducted several special operations to retrieve detainees over the past two years.

In one operation, an elite Sayeret Matkal unit infiltrated a house in Khan Younis.

Hamas fighters quickly responded to the attack, resulting in serious injuries to the Israeli force and the death of one of the detainees, whose body Hamas managed to retrieve.

# News Roundup: Hamas Messages at US, Canadian Airports; Israel Shells Shuja'iyya

#### **Pro-Hamas Messages Broadcast at US and Canadian Airports:**

Reuters, citing officials, reported that the public address systems at three Canadian airports and one US airport were hacked to broadcast messages in praise of Hamas.

Officials confirmed that both flight information display screens and the public address system were compromised.

A spokesperson stated that hackers broadcast messages and music over the airport's public address system.

Canadian police confirmed that the public announcement service was subjected to a brief intrusion and unauthorized content was aired.

#### **Satellite Images Show Israeli Fortification in Gaza:**

Satellite images have detected that the Israeli army is expanding and reinforcing some of its deployment points in areas that were not part of the initial withdrawal plan.

The reinforcement includes a center in the Shuja'iyya neighborhood (east of Gaza City) and the Philadelphi Axis (along the border strip between the Gaza Strip and Egypt).

#### Israeli Closures East of Ramallah:

Israeli occupation forces closed the entrances to several villages east of Ramallah this morning following a shooting attack targeting a settler's vehicle.

#### Palestinian Killed North of Jerusalem:

The Palestinian Red Crescent reported that a Palestinian was killed after being struck on the head by Israeli forces near the Qalandiya checkpoint north of Jerusalem.

## Widespread West Bank Raids:

Israeli forces carried out a large-scale campaign of raids and incursions, including the home of the recently released, deported prisoner Yusuf Dawoud in Deir Ghassana, west of Ramallah.

#### **Fatal and Non-Fatal Shootings:**

A teenager was injured by Israeli fire in Kafr Aqab, north of Jerusalem, and a young man was shot by Israeli forces in Qabatiya, south of Jenin.

#### **Settler Vandalism:**

Illegal Jewish settlers destroyed over 150 olive trees in the village of Bardala in the North Jordan Valley.

#### **Artillery Shelling East of Gaza City:**

Israeli artillery continues to target areas east of the Shujaiya neighborhood in Gaza City.

#### **Italy Supports Palestinian State Recognition:**

Italian Foreign Minister Antonio Tajani stated that Italian recognition of a Palestinian state is "closer than ever," and emphasized that enhancing security in Gaza is the priority for reconstruction.

#### **US Envoy Confident on Remains Return:**

US Envoy Steve Witkoff stated his confidence in the return of all remains of the dead hostages from the Gaza Strip and stressed that Hamas must unequivocally disarm.
