Israeli forces intensified their bombardment of southern Gaza, with artillery, tank fire, and airstrikes hitting Khan Yunis and Rafah, killing a child and injuring several civilians near aid centers.

Meanwhile, Israeli helicopters carried out evacuation operations south of Khan Yunis as sirens sounded in nearby Israeli settlements.

Since October 7, 2023, Israel has killed 67,074 and injured 169,430 others, the majority of whom are women and children, according to the Palestinian Ministry of Health in Gaza.

Khan Younis Tragedy:

Three Palestinians died due to a landslide collapse on tents on the Al-Qarara coast north of Khan Yunis.

Eight injuries were reported following an Israeli shelling attack on a displacement tent northwest of Khan Younis.

Gaza City Casualties:

A source at Al-Shifa Hospital reported three were killed in an Israeli shelling attack on the Al-Sabra neighborhood in southern Gaza City.

Attacks on Gaza:

Israeli occupation warplanes carried out new airstrikes on several areas across Gaza City.

Artillery shelling targeted various areas of the city.

The Israeli military blew up residential buildings in the Al-Sabra neighborhood.

The Israeli army reportedly detonated three explosive robot vehicles in Al-Sabra.

A series of violent explosions were heard in the Al-Karama and Intelligence Towers areas in the northwest of the city.

Khan Yunis:

Israeli warplanes carried out airstrikes on the central area of Khan Yunis.

Nuseirat:

Israeli gunboats shelled the southwestern coastal area of the Nuseirat refugee camp in the central sector.

Rocket Fire from Gaza:

The Israeli occupation army reported detecting a rocket launch from northern Gaza – no injuries reported.

Israeli Channel 12 reported detecting a rocket launch, presumed to have fallen in an open area.

Air raid sirens sounded in Netiv HaAsara in northern Gaza.

West Bank Incursions and Arrests

Qalqilya:

Israeli forces launched a widespread raid of citizens' homes in Qalqilya, arresting several Palestinians, including one who had been released just hours earlier.

Jalazone Camp:

Israeli forces raided the Jalazone refugee camp north of Ramallah and searched a number of homes.

Hamas Talks in Sharm El Sheikh 'Positive'; Greta Treated Badly

Initial talks between mediators and the Hamas delegation in Sharm El Sheikh have concluded with 'positive' signs.

Positive Talks and Roadmap:

Al-Jazeera sources claimed that the first round of talks was "positive" and established a roadmap and mechanisms for the current discussions.

Hamas Condition:

The Hamas delegation informed the mediators that the continuation of the bombing in Gaza constitutes a challenge to the process of releasing the detainees.

Hamas Delegation:

The delegation included Khalil Al-Hayya and Zaher Jabareen, who were part of the group that survived the recent assassination attempt in Doha.

Flotilla Aftermath:

A number of Turkish activists who were aboard the Global Flotilla of Resilience have returned to their country. A total of 137 participants, including 36 Turkish citizens, were transported to Istanbul via a special flight.

Returning activists said that climate activist Greta Thunberg was subjected to "very bad treatment" during the Israeli interception.

West Bank Incursion:

Israeli occupation forces raided the town of Birzeit, north of Ramallah, in the occupied West Bank.

Greta Thunberg: We Tried to Raise Our Voices on Gaza after Our Governments Failed

AL JAZEERA: Swedish activist Greta Thunberg, recently released after being detained as part of the Freedom Flotilla, told Al Jazeera that she and her fellow activists were "mistreated by Israel, which continues to commit genocide against Palestinians in Gaza."

She said, "There is a genocide taking place in Gaza, and the world must intervene to stop it." Thunberg criticized Western governments for failing to protect human rights in Gaza, urging them to meet their legal obligations to end the genocide and stop colluding with Israel.

"We tried to raise our voices about what's happening in Gaza after our governments failed to do so," she said, adding that their mission goes beyond delivering aid — "we aim to end Israeli occupation and oppression."
