Britain, Australia, Portugal, and Canada formally recognized the State of Palestine on Sunday, bringing the total number of recognizing states to 148 out of 193 UN members.

Meanwhile, Israeli forces continued heavy bombardment across Gaza on Sunday, killing at least 20 Palestinians as UN agencies warned of mass displacement, famine, and an escalating humanitarian catastrophe.

Since October 7, 2023, Israel has killed 65,344 and injured 166,795 others, the majority of whom are women and children, according to the Palestinian Ministry of Health in Gaza.

Abbas also committed to holding elections within a year after the war and reiterated recognition of Israel's right to exist, while urging Israel to halt settlement expansion and sit at the negotiating table.

Channel 12: Trump May Present Plan to End Gaza War Tomorrow

ISRAELI MEDIA: Israeli Channel 12 quoted American officials as saying that President Donald Trump and his envoy Steve Witkoff may present a plan tomorrow, Tuesday, to Arab and Muslim leaders to end the war in Gaza. The report cited an Israeli official who said Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu already knows some details of Trump's plan and that Israel may be forced to accept parts of it. Netanyahu is expected to discuss the plan with Trump during their meeting at the White House. Earlier, the White House announced that Trump will hold a "multilateral meeting" with Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Indonesia, Turkey, Pakistan, Egypt, the United Arab Emirates, and Jordan.

News Roundup: Massacres in Gaza, Escalation in West Bank, Heightened International Pressure

Gaza Genocide Updates:

Hospital sources in Gaza report that 37 Palestinians have been killed by Israeli fire since dawn today, with 30 of the casualties in Gaza City alone.

Separate reports detail a series of airstrikes and artillery attacks, including an Israeli strike that killed 7 people in a residential building in central Gaza City and another that targeted the Tal al-Hawa neighborhood.

The Israeli army has demolished buildings in southern Khan Yunis.

Palestinian resistance groups report continued fighting, with the Qassam Brigades targeting an Israeli tank with a powerful explosive device in southern Gaza City.

The Israeli army acknowledged intercepting a rocket fired from Gaza today, and earlier, a rocket aimed at Nahal Oz.

The Gaza Ministry of Health announced that Al-Rantisi Children's Hospital and the Al-Oyun Eye Hospital are now out of service due to continuous shelling. The ministry accused Israel of systematically targeting the health system in the Gaza governorate.

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu stated that Israel is "determined to achieve all the goals of our war," not just in Gaza but on other fronts, to provide security and victory. This comes as demonstrations continue outside his home in Jerusalem, with protesters demanding an end to the war and the return of hostages.

The Qassam Brigades released a video of an Israeli captive, Alon Ohayon, who called on the US government to stop supporting Netanyahu's decisions and urged the American envoy to not let Netanyahu "kill us."

The Israeli army confirmed that a Givati Brigade officer was seriously injured in a clash in Gaza City and that an officer was moderately wounded in a separate incident in northern Gaza.

European Response to Palestine Recognition:

A European official told The Washington Post that they are prepared to respond with "harsh" measures if Israel retaliates against recent recognitions of a Palestinian state by annexing the West Bank. The European Commission may consider imposing trade sanctions on West Bank settlement exports.

The UK's Foreign Secretary confirmed that a Palestinian state is a fundamental right and that Britain has now officially recognized it, calling it a step towards a two-state solution. She noted that the UK has placed restrictions on arms exports to Israel and sanctioned individuals in the Israeli government.

The Foreign Minister of Ireland said that while recognition is important, it is "not enough," and real action is needed to stop the genocide and famine in Gaza.

The Prime Minister of Scotland welcomed the recognition, urging the UK government to use it to pressure Israel and immediately stop the "genocide."

The government of Germany stated there is "no alternative" to a two-state solution.

The UN Secretary-General's spokesperson, Stéphane Dujarric, told Al-Jazeera that the upcoming New York conference is more than symbolic and that the international community must "overcome Israel's approach of intimidation."

The Qatari Foreign Ministry spokesperson warned that the Israeli attack on Qatar puts all agreements in the region at risk, as it targeted the very principle of peaceful mediation.

Human Rights Watch called on world leaders to take urgent action to stop Israel's genocide and crimes against Palestinians in Gaza.

Flotilla Statement:

The "Flotilla of Resilience" group condemned Israel's attempts to "criminalize" their humanitarian mission, calling it an effort to "delegitimize aid and justify aggression."

The Israeli Embassy in London expressed its rejection of Britain's recognition of a Palestinian state, alongside Australia, Canada, and Portugal. The embassy claimed that such recognition is a "reward for terrorism" and "harms the chances for peace in the region."

Hamas Welcomes Recognition:

A leader of the Hamas movement, Mahmoud Mardawi, welcomed the recognition of a Palestinian state by the Western countries, calling it a "victory for the Palestinian right and the justice of our cause."

Threats Against France:

An unnamed Israeli minister told the UK's Telegraph newspaper that France will pay a "heavy price" for its efforts to pressure Israel to stop its genocide in Gaza.

The minister claimed that this is in response to French President Emmanuel Macron's "maneuvers" to impose new pressure on Israel.
