Amnesty International issued a statement urging protection for the flotilla as it approached Gaza's shores, voicing concern over Israeli threats.

Meanwhile, Palestinian resistance groups said they turned Gaza City into a frontline battleground, raiding Israeli soldiers at close range and destroying tanks and vehicles, with Israel confirming serious casualties.

Since October 7, 2023, Israel has killed 66,148 and injured 168,716 others, the majority of whom are women and children, according to the Palestinian Ministry of Health in Gaza.

Israeli Navy Intercepts Gaza-Bound Flotilla; International Outcry Over 'Maritime Piracy'

Flotilla Interception Update:

The Israeli Navy has begun intercepting the Global Flotilla of Resilience in international waters, an operation that is expected to continue:

Ships Intercepted:

Al-Jazeera's correspondent reported that the Navy has so far intercepted 4 out of 44 ships participating in the aid effort, with the seized vessels carrying dozens of activists. Israeli Channel 13, however, claimed the Navy has seized control of 6 ships.

Ongoing Operation:

Israeli sources indicated that the operation to gain control of the Flotilla is expected to continue until tomorrow, Thursday. The Navy previously detained those aboard three seized ships and instructed the remaining vessels to sail toward the Israeli port of Ashdod.

Condemnation as 'Piracy':

The Islamic Jihad movement strongly condemned the Israeli action as a "barbaric aggression" and an act of "maritime piracy," calling it a blatant violation of international law. The group held Israel fully responsible for the safety of all participants.

European MP Denounces Action:

European Parliament member Brando Benifei said the interception was "criminal and illegal." He criticized the international community for failing to protect the fleet and warned that the seizure would "increase European anger toward Israel."

France Demands Safety and Access:

French Foreign Minister Jean-Noël Barrot called on Israel to guarantee the safety of the flotilla's participants and ensure their right to consular protection. The French Foreign Ministry confirmed it is in contact with Israel to secure consular protection for its citizens aboard the fleet.

Rome Demonstration:

A demonstration was held in the Italian capital, Rome, to protest the Israeli Navy's interception of the Flotilla of Resilience. A number of Italian citizens are participating in the global aid initiative.

The Israeli military announced that Rashid Street, on the southern side of the Gaza Strip, would be closed starting at 12:00 noon local time.

The statement explained that movement southward would remain available for those unable to evacuate Gaza City earlier.

Global Flotilla of Resilience Update

The Flotilla of Resilience encountered a direct confrontation as it continued its journey toward the Gaza coast:

Five-Foot Proximity: An Israeli vessel approached the Alma ship, the lead vessel of the global flotilla, to a distance of just five feet.

Systems Jammed: The Israeli ship used electronic warfare to jam and disable all communication systems on the Alma, including its engine, and disrupted communication systems on several other ships in the fleet.

Voyage Resumes: The Israeli ship later departed the location, and the Flotilla of Resilience resumed its course toward the shores of the Gaza Strip.

High Alert: Participants on the flotilla were on high alert and had completed all necessary drills to deal with the possibility of a raid or interception.

17 Palestinians Killed in Israeli Strikes

PALESTINIAN MEDIA: Hospital sources in Gaza reported that 17 Palestinians have been killed in Israeli airstrikes across various areas of the Strip since dawn this Wednesday.

Humanitarian Flotilla Update and Gaza Strikes

Warship Sighted:

Al-Jazeera's correspondent reported sighting a large warship near the location of the flotilla's ships, placing the fleet on maximum alert.

Near Interception Point:

The fleet is approaching the 120-nautical-mile mark from Gaza, a distance where previous aid ships have been intercepted.

Maximum Alert:

The flotilla's administration confirmed that the fleet returned to a state of maximum alert after unknown vessels approached their ships without lights.

"Alma" Ship Contact Lost:

Al-Jazeera reported that contact was lost with the participants on the ship "Alma," after participants followed protocol and reportedly disposed of their mobile phones in the sea.

Voyage Continues:

A spokesperson for the flotilla affirmed that they are continuing their journey toward the Gaza shores despite attempts to jam their route.

Central Gaza Strikes:

Ambulance and emergency sources in Gaza reported the killing of three Palestinians in Israeli airstrikes that targeted two homes in the Nuseirat and Al-Bureij refugee camps in the central Gaza Strip.

Gaza Strikes Kill 13 in Residential Area; Flotilla Navigates High-Risk Zone Massacre Reported in Gaza City:

Local sources reported a "major massacre" resulting in the killing of at least 13 Palestinians and a large number of injuries. The casualties were caused by Israeli strikes targeting the Abu Kmail family home in the Al-Daraj neighborhood and the Al-Falah School, which was sheltering displaced people in the Al-Zaitoun neighborhood.

Al-Rimal Strike:

One was killed and several wounded were transferred to Al-Shifa Hospital following an Israeli strike on a residential apartment in the Al-Rimal neighborhood.

Flotilla of Resilience Status:

The Global Flotilla of Resilience, heading toward Gaza, entered the high-risk zone where previous fleets faced Israeli attacks:

The flotilla reported an increase in drone activity, with Al-Jazeera's correspondent observing approximately 20 drones flying over the ships.

A flotilla administration member, Yasmin Ajar, stated they were experiencing communications jamming, called the Israeli actions "piracy," and expected an attack and interception that night, noting similarities to the previous Mavi Marmara interception.

Shortly after, the flotilla announced a lowering of the alert level, stating that an interception was "most likely not expected" that night.

Ramallah Raid:

Israeli forces raided Al-Manara Square in the center of the city of Ramallah in the occupied West Bank.

Israeli Strikes on Gaza Kill Civil Defense Worker and Civilians

PALESTINIAN MEDIA:

A member of the Civil Defense crews was killed after being targeted by Israeli aircraft while attempting to treat the wounded following a strike on Al-Falah School in the Al-Zaitoun neighborhood of Gaza City.

One Palestinian was killed and others were wounded following a strike on a house in the Al-Bureij refugee camp in central Gaza.

A Palestinian was killed and others were wounded following an Israeli strike that targeted a residential apartment on Al-Thawra Street in the Al-Rimal neighborhood, west of Gaza City, according to local sources.

Intense Bombing in Gaza City:

Local sources reported that Israeli drones dropped dozens of high-explosive bombs on residential homes in the Al-Sahaba area of the Al-Daraj neighborhood (central Gaza). A residential building near the City Market was also targeted.

Attack on Civil Defense:

Israeli aircraft reportedly bombed Civil Defense crews while they were attempting to treat the wounded at the Al-Falah School in the Al-Zaitoun neighborhood (south Gaza), causing injuries among the rescue staff.

UN Report:

The UN Special Rapporteur on the Right to Housing told Al-Jazeera that they are receiving reports of actions in the Gaza Strip that "amount to genocide," describing the accounts from residents who left the Strip as "horrendous and tragic."

Entering Danger Zone:

The Flotilla of Resilience announced it is on a state of "maximum alert" as it has arrived within 10 nautical miles of the "high-danger zone."

Drone Surveillance:

Media reports speak of intense drone activity, including unidentified reconnaissance drones flying at medium altitudes over the flotilla's location in the Mediterranean Sea.

West Bank Incursions:

Israeli forces conducted multiple raids across the West Bank:

In Tulkarem, a young man named Fares Abed Rabbo was arrested during a raid on the Eastern Neighborhood.

In Hebron, forces raided the Al-Baladiyah suburb.

In Ramallah, forces entered the town of Beitunia.

Ansarallah Attack:

The military spokesman for Ansarallah claimed that the group targeted the vessel Minervagrace in the Gulf of Aden with a cruise missile. The spokesman stated the ship caught fire and is at risk of sinking, citing the ship owner's violation of the ban on entering Israeli ports.

Israeli media reported that Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu stated during a government session that Minister of Strategic Affairs Ron Dermer "will soon conclude his duties."
