Witkoff and Kushner to Draft Plan for Hamas Disarmament

US envoy Steve Witkoff and presidential adviser Jared Kushner will focus during their upcoming visit on continuing efforts to locate the bodies of Israeli captives and on establishing an international stabilization force in Gaza.

They reportedly requested that Israel allow a Turkish team to assist in the search for bodies and emphasized that Washington "will not allow Israel to reduce humanitarian aid to the Strip."

The two will also work on formulating a plan for the disarmament of Hamas and Gaza.

HAMAS: Hamas spokesman Hazem Qassem stated that the movement does not wish to take part in any administrative arrangements concerning the governance of the Gaza Strip.

He said Hamas agreed to form a Community Support Committee to assume governing responsibilities in Gaza and called for accelerating its establishment until a broader administrative body is agreed upon by all Palestinian factions.

Qassem noted that government institutions in Gaza continue to perform their duties, emphasizing that "any vacuum is extremely dangerous."

He added that discussions are underway with mediators to prepare for the second phase of negotiations, describing it as "complex," and said that efforts have begun to shape a unified national position on key issues.

The demonstration, organized at Nasser Medical Complex with the participation of the Ministry of Health, featured banners and photos of detained doctors, nurses, and healthcare workers.

According to the Gaza Government Media Office, Israel has detained 362 medical staff members during the two-year genocide, including 88 doctors, 132 nurses, 72 medical assistants, and 47 administrative employees in the health sector.

In an interview with Al-Jazeera, Al-Bitar explained that before the war there were 17,000 orphans, but their number has more than tripled during Israel's genocide, reaching 57,000.

He added that 40,000 children lost one or both parents, and some were left as the only survivors in their families.
